Handling of all animals shall be done as expeditiously and carefully as possible in a manner that does not cause trauma, overheating, excessive cooling, behavioral stress, physical harm, or unnecessary discomfort.

At the time of inspection it was discovered that a primate had been left unattended in a restraint chair, while the technician went to retrieve a piece of equipment.

Personnel should not leave animals unattended while in a restraint chair, so as to prevent the occurrence of stress, harm or discomfort. In addition personnel need to develop a method of communication so that if a piece of equipment is needed it can be retrieved without leaving the animal alone.
